Dear Mr. Harris:

I represent Defendant-Appellees Doug Burgum, in his official capacity as Governor of North Dakota, and Michael Howe, in his official capacity as North Dakota Secretary of State. Pursuant to Rule 30.4, I write to request a 31-day extension, to May 6, 2024, of the time to respond to Plaintiff-Appellants' jurisdictional statement in the above-captioned matter.

Defendant-Intervenor-Appellees The Mandan, Hidatsa, and Arikara Nation, Lisa DeVille, and Cesar Alvarez, Jr. join in this request and ask for the same 31-day extension to respond to Plaintiff-Appellants' jurisdictional statement. Plaintiff-Appellants Charles Walen and Paul Henderson do not oppose this request.

There is good cause for the extension in light of multiple upcoming commitments that the attorneys representing Defendant-Appellees have in other matters. Counsel for Defendant-Appellees have multiple briefing deadlines in several matters in the coming weeks, including Alpine v. FINRA, No. 23-5129 (D.C. Cir.) (briefs due on both March 22 and March 29), Fort v. Grisham, No. 23-2167 (10th Cir.) (brief due on March 26), Turtle Mountain Band of Chippewa Indians et al. v. Howe, No. 23-3655 (8th Cir.) (brief due April 8), and Nw. Landowners Ass'n v. North Dakota, No. 05-2023-cv-00065 (N.D., Bottineau Cnty.) (brief due April 12). Counsel for Defendant-Appellees are also heavily engaged in discovery in AmBase Corp. v. 111 West 57th Sponsor LLC, No. 652301/2016 (N.Y. Sup. Ct. N.Y. Cnty.) and 111 West 57th Investment LLC v. 111W57 Mezz Investor LLC, No. 655031/2017 (N.Y. Sup. Ct. N.Y. Cnty.), as well as pretrial preparations in NAACP v. NC State Board of Elections, No. 1:18-cv-1034 (M.D.N.C.), for a trial set to commence in early May.

This case also raises complex and important questions of constitutional and statutory law. The requested extension will enable Counsel for Defendant-Appellees to prepare a response adequately addressing those questions.

For these reasons, Defendant-Appellees and Defendant-Intervenor-Appellees respectfully request an extension of time to respond to the jurisdictional statement in this matter until May 6, 2024.
