SUPPLEMENTAL DECLARATION OF JOSH BRIDGES

Pursuant to 28 U.S.C. 1746, I declare:

- 1. I am over 18 years of age and have personal knowledge of the facts set out in this declaration.
- 2. I am the same Josh Bridges who previously submitted a declaration in this case. *See* DE 53-2.
- 3. Under Arkansas law, the Secretary of State is the custodian of official State records, including election results. *See* Ark. Code Ann. 25-16-403. The Secretary of State is also the State's top election official.
- 4. I have been asked to provide information on historical election returns. The Secretary of State's office keeps these records in the course of its regularly conducted business.
- 5. Mark McElroy ran for House District 11 as a Democrat in the 2012, 2014, and 2016 election cycles. He ran unopposed in the primary and general elections in 2012 and 2014. He defeated Bob G. Ware in the 2016 Preferential Primary to win the Democratic nomination. Out of a total of 4,547 votes cast, McElroy received 2,493 (54.83%) and Ware received 2,054 (45.17%). McElroy was unopposed in the 2016 general election.
- 6. Milton Nicks, Jr. ran for House District 50 as a Democrat in the 2018 and 2020 election cycles. He ran unopposed in the primary and general elections.

7. Monte Hodges ran for House District 55 as a Democrat in the 2018 and 2020 election cycles. Gary Tobar was the Republican candidate in both general elections. In 2018, out of a total of 6,284 votes cast, Hodges received 3,878 (61.71%), and Tobar received 2,406 (38.29%). In 2020, out of a total of 7,028 votes cast, Hodges received 3,666 (52.16%) and Tobar received 3,362 (47.84%).
