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and *Garcia* Plaintiff Benancio Garcia III (collectively, "Movants"), hereby request that the Court grant leave to file a joint post-trial brief in excess of 40 pages.

Specifically, Movants seek to file a joint post-trial brief of up to 50 pages, which they believe will be more efficient for the Court than filing two separate sub-40-page briefs in *Soto Palmer* and *Garcia* that would contain some overlapping and some distinct material.

At the end of trial, the Court indicated that it was "not going to set page limits," but requested that counsel "try to keep them in the 30-page neighborhood," or if the brief exceeds 40 pages, "please seek permission." (Trial Tr. 880:3–12.) Movants are, therefore, seeking such permission from the Court.

Additionally, Counsel for Movants have contacted Counsel for all other parties in both *Soto Palmer* and *Garcia*, and no party opposes Movants' request to file a single, 50-page closing brief.

In light of these factors, Movants respectfully request the Court's leave to file a joint post-trial brief with up to ten (10) additional pages, for a total limit of fifty (50) pages.
