MEMORANDUM OF LAW IN SUPPORT OF GOVERNOR ROY A. COOPER, III AND ATTORNEY GENERAL JOSHUA H. STEIN'S MOTION FOR LEAVE TO FILE AMICUS CURIAE BRIEF IN SUPPORT OF PLAINTIFFS' MOTION FOR A PRELIMINARY INJUNCTION North Carolina Governor Roy A. Cooper, III and Attorney General Joshua H. Stein respectfully submit this memorandum in support of their motion for leave to file an amicus curiae brief in support of Plaintiffs' motion for a preliminary injunction.¹

SUMMARY OF THE NATURE OF THE CASE

In late October 2023, the North Carolina General Assembly enacted a statute establishing new districts for the North Carolina Senate. First Am. Compl. ¶ 33, ECF No. 13 (citing Act of Oct. 25, 2023, S.L. No. 2023-146). Plaintiffs filed this lawsuit challenging certain of these districts. *Id.* ¶ 1. They claim that the new Senate districts for northeastern North Carolina violate Section 2 of the Voting Rights Act, which prohibits districting plans that deny minority voters the ability to elect their preferred candidates. *Id.* ¶¶ 84-98. Plaintiffs also sought a preliminary injunction to ensure that the challenged districts are not used in future elections. Pls.' Mot. for Prelim. Inj. at 1-2, ECF No. 16.

STATEMENT OF THE FACTS

The Governor and Attorney General respectfully refer the Court to the statement of facts in Plaintiffs' memorandum in support of their motion for a preliminary injunction. *See* Mem. in Supp. of Pls.' Mot. for Prelim. Inj. at 3-6, ECF No. 17. In that statement, Plaintiffs show that they live in northeastern North Carolina, where Black citizens form a majority or a substantial portion of the population in many counties. *Id.* Plaintiffs also show that the newly enacted Senate districts divide the Black population of these counties among multiple districts, preventing Plaintiffs from joining together with other Black voters to elect candidates of their choice. *See id.*

¹ The Attorney General has recused himself from representing the North Carolina State Board of Elections, its members, or any of the other defendants in this case.

ARGUMENT

I. The Governor and Attorney General Have a Special Interest in This Case.

This Court should grant the Governor and Attorney General's motion for leave to file an amicus brief because they have a strong interest in being heard with respect to Plaintiffs' claims. This interest arises from their central roles in state government and their duties to the people of North Carolina.

The Governor and Attorney General are elected statewide to serve all the people of North Carolina. N.C. Const. art. III, §§ 2(1), 7(1). The Governor is North Carolina's chief executive officer. *Id.* § 1. He bears primary responsibility for enforcing the State's laws. *Id.* § 5(4). The Attorney General is, in turn, North Carolina's chief legal officer. *See* N.C. Gen. Stat. § 114-1.1; *Tice v. Dep't of Transp.*, 67 N.C. App. 48, 52, 312 S.E.2d 241, 244 (1984). He is charged with defending the State, its constitution, and the rights that it guarantees to North Carolinians. N.C. Gen. Stat. § 114-2; *Martin v. Thornburg*, 320 N.C. 533, 546, 359 S.E.2d 472, 479 (1987).

Given these roles, the Governor and Attorney General have a strong interest in being heard to ensure that the State complies with the federal laws that secure the voting rights of its citizens. In 1868, when North Carolina was readmitted to the Union after the Civil War, the people of North Carolina amended their constitution to underscore that federal law is supreme over state law, mandating that "no law or ordinance of the State in contravention or subversion [of federal law] can have any binding force." N.C. Const. art. I, § 5. In keeping with this guarantee protecting North Carolinians' federal rights, the North Carolina Supreme Court has recognized that when the General Assembly draws legislative districts, it must first draw districts required by the Voting Rights Act before complying with state-law requirements. *Stephenson v. Bartlett*, 355 N.C. 354, 383, 562 S.E.2d 377, 396-97 (2002). Here, however, Plaintiffs have shown that the General Assembly failed to comply with the Voting Rights Act when it enacted new Senate districts. *See* Mem. in Supp. of Pls.' Mot. for Prelim. Inj. at 7-20, ECF No. 17. Given this failure, the Governor and Attorney General have a strong interest in being heard to fulfill their constitutional duties to protect North Carolinians' federal rights.

II. Hearing the Governor and Attorney General's Views Will Assist the Court.

This Court should also grant the Governor and Attorney General's motion for leave because hearing from these officials concerning the important issues in this case will assist this Court. Both officials represent all the people of North Carolina, including the voters who have been harmed by the State's failure to comply with the Voting Rights Act. Also, given their status as state constitutional officers, both officials have a special understanding of the need to ensure a state government that is representative of all North Carolinians and the crucial role that the Voting Rights Act plays in securing such a government.

Granting the motion, moreover, is also appropriate because elections cases commonly lend themselves to amicus participation. Elections cases like this one have broad importance for the entire public, making the views of interested non-parties helpful for the courts hearing these cases. Thus, even though the local rules do not expressly contemplate the filing of amicus briefs, district courts in North Carolina have routinely accepted amicus briefs in elections cases at the preliminary injunction stage. *See, e.g., Democracy N.C. v. N.C. State Bd. of Elections*, No. 1:20cv-457, 2020 WL 6589358, at *1 (M.D.N.C. July 8, 2020) (Osteen, Jr., J.) (accepting amicus brief in elections case opposing motion for preliminary injunction); *United States v. North Carolina*, No. 1:13-cv-00861 (M.D.N.C. June 19, 2014) (Schroeder, J.) (same). For example, in *North Carolina Green Party v. North Carolina State Board of Elections*, this Court recently granted the National Republican Senatorial Committee's motion seeking leave to file an amicus brief supporting a motion for a preliminary injunction. 619 F. Supp. 3d 547, 552 (E.D.N.C. 2022) (Dever, J.). Because hearing from amici here will assist this Court in the same way as in *Green Party*, the Governor and Attorney General's motion for leave should be granted.²

CONCLUSION

Governor Cooper and Attorney General Stein respectfully request that this Court grant

their motion for leave to file an amicus curiae brief in support of Plaintiffs' motion for a

preliminary injunction.
